



Top stories of the week

On Friday, global bunker prices generally decreased, with the global average for VLSFO falling for a fifth consecutive day. The Ship & Bunker G20-VLSFO Index declined by \$2/mt to \$554/mt, reaching its lowest level since June 12, and the G20-HSFO Index fell by \$5.50/mt to \$472.50/mt. In contrast, the G20-MGO Index rose by \$2.50/mt to \$757.50/mt. This trend occurred even as ICE Brent crude futures saw a slight increase. Prices at the top four VLSFO ports were mixed, with Singapore and Rotterdam seeing modest increases, Fujairah a slight decrease, and Houston a more significant rise. By the following Monday morning, Brent crude futures had retreated slightly, suggesting a potential for a continued modest decline in bunker prices. (Ship& Bunker, June 30, 2025)

> The American Bureau of Shipping (ABS) has granted an approval in principle (AiP) to the Norwegian shipping firm Færder Tankers Norway for its design of a 50,000 m3 dual-fuel ammonia bunkering vessel. This vessel, named "Workhorse." was developed collaboration with the ship design firm SDARI. It is designed to transport and bunker liquid ammonia and will also be capable of carrying LPG. The design is part of a memorandum of understanding with Copenhagen Infrastructure Partners (CIP) to develop ammonia-fuelled carriers to service the transport and bunkering requirements for CIP's ammonia projects. The first vessel from this initiative is anticipated to be delivered in the second half of 2028. (Ship&
